Professional instructors and law enforcement officers will present important crime prevention tips and safety techniques specifically for students entering college.

Participants will receive information on personal safety and self-defense, travel safety, distracted and impaired driving, protecting your identity and possessions, banking and finances, dating violence, sexual assault awareness, and drug and alcohol awareness.
