Five Caddo deputies to receive promotions

Townley and Coleman disarmed a man who produced a weapon when they stopped the vehicle he was in on New Year's Eve. Four other people were also in the car, including two children. Thanks to the actions of the agents, no one was injured. Townley and Coleman will receive the Caddo Sheriff's Distinguished Action Medal for action that exposed them to personal danger above and beyond the normal demands of law enforcement.

Lt. Michael Gray will receive the Sheriff's Lifesaving Award, which is presented for saving or prolonging the life of a citizen. Gray performed CPR on a two-year-old boy who fell into a swimming pool in December. The child was hospitalized for several days but died on December27.
