Winter Storm Warning Details

WHAT: Heavy mixed precipitation expected. Total snow accumulations between 2 and 6 inches (with locally higher amounts north of I-30), and ice accumulations up to a third of an inch.

IMPACTS: Roads, and especially bridges and overpasses, will likely become slick and hazardous. The strong winds and weight of snow on tree limbs may down power lines and could cause sporadic power outages. Plan on slippery road conditions. These hazardous road conditions could impact the Thursday evening and Friday morning commutes.

WHERE: Portions of south central and southwest Arkansas, southeast Oklahoma, northeast Texas & northwest Louisiana.

WHEN: From Thursday morning through Noon on



Winter Weather Advisory Details

- Less accumulation of both snow and ice, and more uncertainty has resulted in an advisory being issued farther south and east.
- If confidence increases or there is an increase in the expected impacts, an upgrade to a warning would be necessary.




Winter Storm - Winter Precip Accumulation

January 9th 2025 4:00 AM CST


Valid: 6 AM CST Thursday, January 9th to Noon CST Friday, January 10th

Forecast Storm Total Snow Accumulation



Snow accumulation impacts are expected during the watch/warning period starting 6 AM CST Thursday. As a result of this winter system, snow accumulation between 2 and 6 inches is possible, with higher amounts to the north.

Forecast Storm Total Ice Accumulation



Ice accumulation impacts are expected during the watch/warning period starting 6 AM CST Thursday. As a result of this winter system, ice accumulation up to a third of an inch is


Winter Precipitation Onset Time

What is Expected

 Precipitation associated with a winter storm across the south central US will begin to enter into the Four State Region during the mid to late morning.



Timing: Beginning Midday, through the late afternoon (Earliest Possible Start Time – Latest Possible Start Time)

Zone 1: 9 AM CST - 11 AM CST Zone 2: 10 AM CST - NOON CST Zone 3: 11 AM CST - 2 PM CST



Bridges and overpasses will become slick and freeze in areas where temperatures are below freezing.



Patches of ice will develop quickly on untreated roads.
