A lack of education, technical skills, and job opportunities is identified as a major contributing factor to this cycle. The new re-entry program is designed to address these complex issues directly.

The proposed initiative outlines a framework for a holistic and sustainable re-entry program that combines education, technical training, and support services to provide incarcerated individuals with meaningful opportunities for personal and professional growth. Re-entry education programs have been shown to reduce reoffending rates significantly by equipping individuals with the necessary skills and competencies to reintegrate successfully into their communities. The program is important not only for returning citizens but also for the overall well-being and economic growth of Caddo Parish.
