CSO Deputy to hold State position

Caddo Sheriff Steve Prator announced today that Lt. FBI Academy instructional staff, Special Agents and other staff members holding advanced degrees (many of whom are recognized internationally in their fields of expertise) provide training for the program.

The Louisiana Chapter of FBI National Academy Associates was incorporated in Louisiana in January 1984 and has a membership of approximately 400 active and retired law enforcement executives.

Lt. Escudeâ€[™] graduated from the FBI National Academyâ€[™]s 215th session in the Fall of 2003 and was elected and has served on the Executive Board for Louisiana since 2007. He joined the Caddo Parish Sheriffâ€[™]s Office in 1984 and during his 27 years has worked in Corrections, Operations, Administration and several specialty teams.
